Practical-professional profile of the course and reference job market	The second-level Master Course in Periodontology and Implantology is a three-year programme requiring full-time attendance and geared for Dentists eager to have specialized knowledge and training in the field of Periodontology, Reconstructive Therapy, and Implantology. Teaching activities include theory and practice working on patients. A period of active participation in research projects is planned. Training is completed with the presentation of surgically treated clinical cases. At the end of the three-year programme, students discuss a thesis. By the end of the course, students will have acquired theoretical and scientific knowledge pertaining to periodontal and implant therapy. They will also have acquired the specific skills and abilities to independently administer specialized treatments in periodontal and implant cases in patients.
