Practical-professional profile of the course and industry sector of reference	<p>The Master course aims to provide up-to-date theoretical knowledge and practical skills in behavioral addictions, focusing on technology addictions and considering areas of overlap and specificity concerning substance addictions. Specifically, the Course aims to train Psychology and Medical Graduates in the assessment and intervention of significant forms of new addiction (gambling disorder, video game addiction, problematic smartphone use, problematic social network use, compulsive shopping, sex/cybersex addiction). The Master Course-trained professional will be able to work as an expert in different public or private social and health care settings within the addiction network.</p> <p>To this end, training will consist of lectures, group work, case analysis, and practical exercises led by experts. In addition, a practical internship is planned to be held in public and private contracted facilities.</p> <p>At the end of the Course, participants will have acquired the following knowledge and skills:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. knowledge for the framing of behavioral addictions; 2. knowledge about the main theoretical models of behavioral addictions; 3. skills in behavioral addiction assessment 4. expertise in behavioral addiction intervention.

Description of the activities and training objectives of the internship	Students also undertake an internship to practice the skills acquired during the Course and, in particular, identifying, analyzing, and intervening effectively in the area of behavioral addictions. Observational, research, and experiential activities under the supervision of experts will be provided for students who do not yet hold a license to practice. Practical activities on patients are also planned for already licensed students. Observational activity only for Psychology or Medicine graduates not yet registered with the relevant professional body. 150 total hours of internship.
